

Student Exchange and Study Abroad at UWA

Studying abroad is a unique opportunity to travel, experience new cultures, and gain a fresh perspective that'll help you stand out in your career. With our Student Exchange and Study Abroad (SESA) program, you can explore Australia without taking time out from your degree.

Student Exchange

If your university or college has a formal student exchange agreement with UWA, you can apply to study with us as an exchange student. This means you don't pay tuition fees at UWA, but continue to pay the tuition fees of your home university or college.

There are additional costs that both exchange and study abroad students will need to consider, such as an Australian Student Visa, Overseas Student Health Cover (medical insurance), accommodation, books, transport and living expenses.

Study Abroad

If your university or college doesn't have a formal student exchange agreement with UWA, or if all available exchange places have been filled, you can still study with us as a study abroad student. You're also eligible to apply as a study abroad student if you've completed high school but haven't yet enrolled at a university. To study on this basis, tuition fees are payable and are based on a standard enrolment.

As a student exchange or study abroad student, you will have the same rights and privileges enjoyed by other UWA students and must also abide by the same rules and regulations.

Selecting your classes

How many units can I take?

You will need to enrol in a full academic load of 18-24* points per semester. Most units are worth six points, so this typically means enrolling in three to four units per semester. While most units run for a single semester, some may be full-year units. Please check with your home university to confirm the credit requirements for your program.

How do I select my units?

You can use the online UWA Handbook to browse units offered at UWA. Each unit code consists of four letters indicating the discipline (such as ECON for Economics, PSYC for Psychology) followed by four numbers.

 Units beginning with 1 to 3 are generally undergraduate units. A code beginning with 1 represents first-year level studies, 2 represents second-year level studies, and so on.

- Units beginning with 4 are generally honours-level and may require at least of three years' study prior to enrolling. Please note these units are not always available to student exchange and study abroad students.
- Units beginning with 5 and above are postgraduatelevel and require a minimum of three years' study in a relevant field prior to enrolling.
- UWA does not offer a Bachelor of Law, but instead a postgraduate Juris Doctor. As a result, there are restrictions on the Law units that student exchange and study abroad students can enrol in. For more information, contact the Global Learning Office.
- Medicine, Dentistry and Postgraduate Psychology units are not available to student exchange and study abroad students.

Prerequisites

You will need to meet the relevant academic prerequisites in both level and content.

Academic year

The UWA academic year runs from late February to late November. Semester 1 commences in February, Semester 2 commences in July. You are welcome attend UWA for one or two semesters, either within a single academic year or across a split year (starting in July).

Teaching period

You should normally select units which are offered in Semester 1 or Semester 2. If you wish to enrol in units offered in other study periods, contact the Global Learning Office.

Location

You can choose to study at our Perth campus or at the Albany campus, which is located in a rural city five hours south of Perth. If you are considering studying in Albany, please contact the Global Learning Office before you apply. Full year student exchange and study abroad students may also have the option to study one semester in Albany and one semester in Perth.

What can I study?

UWA's curriculum offers a wide range of majors and the flexibility to tailor your study plan to your interests and your home university's credit requirements. HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

At the time of the application, you should have completed a high school qualification that meets with the admission requirements for entry into the relevant bachelor's degree program at UWA (for example, Bachelor of Arts).

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

To study at UWA as a student exchange or study aboard student, you should normally:

- have completed one semester of tertiary study at a recognised institution
- have a nomination from your home university to participate in the UWA Student Exchange and Study Abroad program, if you are applying through a UWA partner university
- be in good academic standing at your home university

POSTGRADUATE STUDENTS

Admission to postgraduate courses normally requires the completion of an undergraduate degree.

In addition to meeting the Academic requirements, students must meet one of the English Language requirements.

Alternative english language pathways

Students who do not meet UWA's standard English Language Competency requirements may be approved admission to UWA on the basis of the Alternative English Language pathway. Admission via this pathway is assessed on a case-by-case basis. If approved, students must enrol in the following unit during their first semester at UWA: Professional and Academic Communications (PACM1100).

Minimum scores for this conditional offer are:

- IELTS 6.0 (no band score below 5.5)
- Internet-based TOEFL 70 (17 in Listening, 19 in Speaking, 14 in Reading, 20 in Writing)
- EAP Pathway: Overall score of 65% (no score less than 60%)
- UWA CELT Pathway: Bridging Course Module 1, overall score 65% / Module 2, overall score 60% (no score less than 60%)

For a full list of the University's English language requirements, refer to **uwa.edu.au/study/how-to-apply/english-language-requirements**. Results for ACT, SAT, TOEFL, IELTS and PTE are valid for two years only.

Applying through a UWA representative overseas

If you are applying via an approved UWA representative, your agent must first nominate you to the Global Learning Office. Once this nomination has been received, you will receive an email from the UWA Global Learning Office inviting you to apply.

Student Exchange

Applying through your home university

If your university has an exchange agreement with UWA, you need to be nominated to participate in the exchange program.

Compulsory application documents

Make sure you have the following documentation ready before you start your application for UWA:

- a colour copy of your passport
- your original academic transcript (or a certified copy)
- evidence of English language competency (if applicable)

Where documents are not in English, a certified English translation must be enclosed with your application.

Application deadlines

Semester 1 (February – June)

- Nominations by 15 October
- Application and documents due by 30 October

Semester 2 (July - November)

- Nominations due by 30 March
- Application and documents due by 15 April

Finances

It's important to have considered the fees and expenses you will incur when you study at UWA. Please ensure you have reviewed the tuition fees and any ancillary fees prior to applying.

Study abroad (not student exchange) students, or their sponsors, must pay tuition fees to UWA. These are paid either through your home institution or directly to UWA.

Exchange students are exempt from paying UWA tuition fees. Instead, these fees are paid to their home institution.




