YOUR UWA DEGREE EXPLAINED

There's a lot of uni language out there – majors, minors, electives, pathways... So, here's a quick guide to what it all means at UWA. Once you've got the basics, you'll see just how flexible your degree can be and how you can shape it your way.

Major

Your **major** is the core of your degree – the area you'll focus on most.

It's a sequence of subjects (called units) that build deep knowledge in one field, like Anatomy and Human Biology, Neuroscience or Public Health.

Degrees include at least one major, and you can often choose two.

Think of it as your main area of expertise.

Extended major

An **extended major** takes your learning even deeper.

It's designed for specialised study in a variety of fields. Whether it's Integrated Dental Sciences, Integrated Medical Sciences and Clinical Practice or Pharmaceutical Health or something else entirely, you'll gain advanced knowledge and professional skills for your chosen career.

Perfect if you already know the field you want to work in.

Minor

A **minor** is a set of four units that let you explore another subject alongside your major.

You might pick something that complements your major, or something totally different, just because it interests you. From Exercise as Medicine and Spanish to Science Communication, Personal Health and Performance, or even Earth's Environmental Challenges, there's something for everyone.

Adds flavour, flexibility and extra skills to your degree.

Foundation units

Some of our degrees have **foundation units**. These are the required core units that set you up for success.

They give you key skills and knowledge to help you thrive in your degree, no matter which major you choose.

Building blocks to your degree.

Elective units

Electives are free-choice subjects from almost any discipline. Try something new, broaden your perspective, or dive deeper into a passion.

Your opportunity to explore.

Bridging units

If your chosen course requires a subject you didn't take – like maths or chemistry – no stress. For those courses, bridging units in your first year help you fill the gap so you can stay on track with your major.

Catch up and stay on track toward your degree.



Honours

Honours is an extra year of study that lets you dive deeper into your area of interest through advanced coursework and a major research or creative project.

Some degrees include honours automatically; others you can apply for after you finish your bachelor's.

Take your degree to the next level.

Combined bachelor's and master's degree

Complete two degrees – undergraduate and postgraduate, in as little as four years.

You'll start postgraduate level study in your third year, getting a head start on advanced qualifications.

Fast-track your career with one clear path.

Assured Pathway

An **Assured Pathway** lets you secure your spot in one of our postgraduate courses like Dentistry, Medicine or Podiatry before you even start your bachelor's degree.

You'll complete both qualifications with clear milestones and guaranteed progression (if you meet your course progression requirements).

Lock in your future from day one.

Graduate entry

If you have commenced tertiary studies or do not qualify for an Assured Pathway you can work towards graduate entry into a postgraduate degree. Refer to pages 20 to 23 for the graduate entry admission requirements for postgraduate health courses at UWA.

ELIGIBILITY AND ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All applicants

- To be considered an international applicant, you cannot be an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or a permanent resident of Australia. Applicants applying for Medicine, Dentistry or Podiatric Medicine who are considering permanent residency in Australia may have their eligibility or enrolment affected. Contact UWA Admissions before applying if you are considering permanent residency.
- All applicants must meet UWA's English language competencies (ELC). The ELC requirement must be met by the application closing date*. More information regarding ELC requirements can be found on the relevant course webpages and uwa.edu.au/study/elc
- Some courses have prerequisites and/or recommended subjects. Refer to the relevant course webpage for the most up-to-date information.

Assured Pathway applicants

- Assured Pathways are exclusive to School Leaver applicants (Year 12 or equivalent) or people who have recently completed Year 12 but have not commenced university studies or vocational training at diploma level or above.
- Applicants who are offered a place in an Assured Pathway must first complete an undergraduate degree at UWA and meet the minimum academic requirements to be able to progress to their postgraduate studies.

Graduate entry applicants

- Your undergraduate degree can be in any chosen field of study; however, some prerequisites apply for Clinical Audiology, Clinical Exercise Physiology, Optometry, Pharmacy, Podiatric Medicine and Psychology courses.
- There are no restrictions placed on the length of time since the completion of the bachelor's degree. UWA considers all Australian bachelor's degrees equally and does not give preference or apply scaling to any degree or university.
- Qualifications obtained outside Australia are assessed according to the National Office of Overseas Skills Recognition.

You'll need your academic results, English test scores, your passport, and any extra documents that may be required for your course. It's important to understand the fees and expenses involved in studying at UWA, and the range of scholarships available to help support you.

4. Apply online

There is an AUD \$150 application fee to submit your application through the UWA Application Portal. Alternatively, you may apply via an authorised agent. You can track your progress online and upload any additional documents if requested.

5. Accept your offer

You'll receive your outcome by email. If successful, follow the steps in your offer email to accept or visit uwa.au/unistart to find out more. Don't forget to arrange accommodation early and make your first payment before the expiry date.

ASSURED PATHWAY APPLICATION PROCESS

Additional application information and how to apply

UWA's Assured Pathways enable you to apply for your bachelor's degree and postgraduate professional degree at the same time. You'll graduate with two UWA degrees, providing you with a well-rounded education and the opportunity to build specialist skills for your future career.

Your place is guaranteed on the basis of your high school performance or equivalent (subject to satisfactory performance in the first two years of your bachelor's degree).

You can apply for an Assured Pathway to the Doctor of Medicine (MD), Doctor of Dental Medicine (DMD) or Doctor of Podiatric Medicine (DPM). If you are offered a place, you'll study the Bachelor of Biomedicine (Specialised) and the respective majors:

- **Medicine:** Integrated Medical Sciences and Clinical Practice (MJD-IMSCP)
- **Dentistry:** Integrated Dental Sciences (MJD-DENTS)
- **Podiatric Medicine:** Podiatric Health and Medical Sciences (MJD-PHMSC)

Here's a breakdown:

- **First year:** Start your degree and study with other medicine, dentistry and podiatric medicine students as a single cohort.
- **Second year:** Continue your study as a single cohort, and achieve the minimum selection GPA at the end of the year to progress onto third year.
- **Third year:** Enrol concurrently in your unique final units of your undergraduate degree and the first-year units of your postgraduate degree. Once you pass, you'll graduate with the Bachelor of Biomedicine (Specialised).

1. International Student Admissions Test (ISAT)

School leaver applicants who wish to be considered for an Assured Pathway to either Medicine or Dentistry must provide a valid ISAT result by the application closing date.

ISAT is not required for Podiatric Medicine.

The test can be sat only once within a 12-month period. If you have more than one valid result, the higher score will be used (not necessarily the most recent score).

2. How and when to apply

Applications are via UWA's online application system, UWA Apply. International students may also apply via an authorised international education agent. Refer to the course webpage for current application timelines for international applicants.

3. Interview

For Medicine and Dentistry, interviews are offered to the top ranked candidates based on their ISAT score and predicted or actual ATAR or equivalent.

Interviews are not required for Podiatric Medicine.

If you're shortlisted for an interview you'll receive information to help you prepare and know what to expect on the day.

Interviewees and interviewers are required to agree to a statement of confidentiality as a condition of participating in the interview process.

As interview dates vary for each course, refer to the relevant course webpage for more specific information, including the interview process, as it becomes available.

4. Final ranking for course offers

Final ranking into our Medicine and Dentistry courses will be based on ATAR or equivalent (30 per cent), interview (50 per cent) and ISAT score (20 per cent).

Final ranking into our Podiatric Medicine course will be based on ATAR or equivalent (an interview is not required).

Important notes

Recommended and prerequisite subjects

There are no mandatory prerequisite subjects, however, there are recommended ATAR subjects for Assured Pathways (these may be taken in your first year of university if not taken at ATAR level).

- Chemistry ATAR
- Mathematics Applications ATAR (or higher)

How can I prepare for the interview?

We recommend you focus on your high school and admission test preparation (or achieving a high GPA and admissions test score for graduate entry) as interviews are only offered to those who score at a certain ranking based on those assessments. Interview preparation information is provided to all students who are offered an interview, and you can find preparation tips on the admissions tab of the Doctor of Medicine and Doctor of Dental Medicine course webpages. We do not endorse any external interview preparation courses.

Interviews are not required for Podiatric Medicine.

Can I take a year off if I have an Assured Pathway place?

If you're offered a place in an Assured Pathway, you can take a year off before commencing your Bachelor of Biomedicine (Specialised) - this is known as deferring your offer*. Successful applicants who are required to complete Singapore National Service are able to defer for up to two years. Once you commence in the bachelor's degree, you'll be expected to study full-time across five or six years, so consider your choice to defer carefully.

*Deferrals are not available if you're offered a graduate entry place.

What if I don't secure a place in an Assured Pathway?

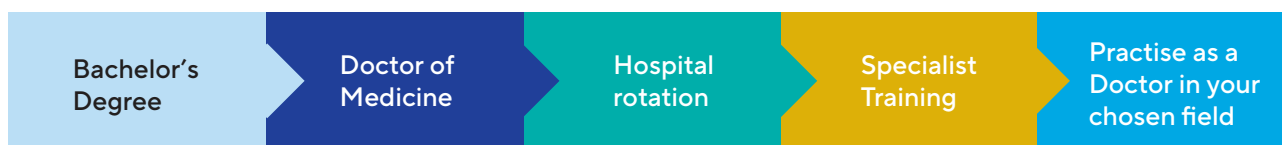

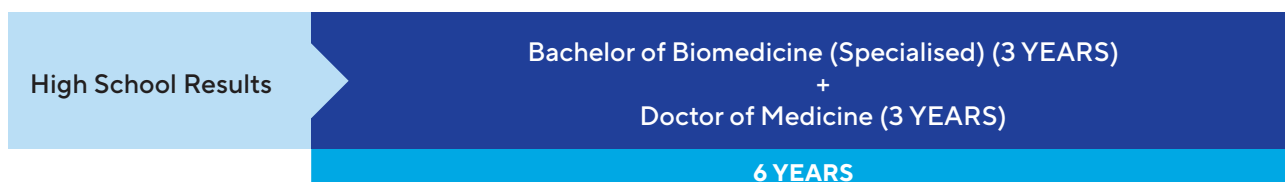
